

#### Objectives of spending PP:

In addition to the key principles Ormiston Meadows Academy;

- Aims for (80%) EYFS children to achieve a GLD and making at least good progress.
- Aims for KS1 pupils to make at least good progress. 85% to achieve Phonics Screening Check.
- 70% to achieve Age Related Expectancy in Maths, Reading, Writing and 73% Spelling Punctuation and Grammar (SPG)-End of KS2.
- To close the attainment gap between eligible pupils and their peers.
- Ensuring that disadvantaged pupils make the progress of which they are capable, with greater proportions reaching the nationally expected standards or the higher standards in reading, writing and mathematics by the end of key stage 2.
