This week's Learning Log:

This week we have been celebrating World Book Day, enjoying a whole sequence of lessons based upon the book 'Little Red Riding Hood'. We enjoyed visiting the woodland area and looking for clues about who might have been there. We then went back inside and read the story before creating missing posters, which was fun. In Topic, we investigated woodland animals in more detail, thinking about their habitats. We even had a go at making our own habitats outdoors!

English

We began the week by investigating the woodland area. We noticed some unusual items in the trees. We found a red ribbon, a piece of red material and a basket which was on the floor with food all around it. It was very suspicious. We had some ideas of who these items belonged to. Then we found a note which confirmed our ideas! We went back inside and read the story of Little Red Riding Hood. We then created missing posters for her, based on the information we had found out. We then had a go at rewriting the story ourselves and we each created a unique alternate ending for the story, which was great fun!

Maths

This week we have been working on cementing our knowledge of reading, writing, recognising and counting numbers to 100. We have been learning to count on 1, 2, or 3 more than numbers up to and just beyond 20. We learnt a trick to help us, by putting the larger number first and counting on to find the answer. We have been adding 1-digit to 2-digit numbers and learning to add to the next multiple of 10, by counting on. We have been using 100 squares and number lines to help us.

You could:

- Practise recalling the 10x tables, recognising the relationship between the numbers.
- Play a game of snakes and ladders to practise counting on from a given number on the board.
